Charles Yu is the author of four books, including *Interior Chinatown* (the winner of the 2020 National Book Award for fiction), and the novel *How to Live Safely in a Science Fictional Universe* (a New York Times Notable Book and a Time magazine best book of the year). He received the National Book Foundation's 5 Under 35 Award and was nominated for two Writers Guild of America Awards for his work on the HBO series, Westworld. Together with TaiwaneseAmerican.org, he established the Betty L. Yu and Jin C. Yu Writing Prizes, in honor of his parents.
