### New Carrollton Branch Opening

The newly renovated branch opened in the Fall of 2018, featuring the Discovery Reef children's area, including an awe-inspiring 270-gallon salt water aquarium, colorful overhead lighting that simulates the underwater experience, a reef wall seating area complete with life-like exotic fish, a storytime room that replicates a deep sea habitat and a glowing tube of moving bubbles.



### Hip Hop Architecture

40 middle school applicants attended a week-long program to explore architecture, design and urban planning, generate and print 3D models using Autodesk Tinkercad, and learn the basics of music composition, songwriting and music video production.



#### Tim Junkin Author Visit

Tim Junkin, author of Bloodsworth: The True Story of the First Death Row Inmate Exonerated by DNA Evidence, visited our Bowie Branch Library as part of the One Maryland One Book community reading program. He presented a thought-inspiring program for our community members. We were also able to livestream the program to teens in select PGCPS high schools and invited the classes to join the conversation.

### Hyattsville Branch Groundbreaking

We celebrated the beginning of construction on the new, upcoming Hyattsville Branch Library. The new 40,000-square-foot Hyattsville Branch Library has been designed with many sustainable features such as roof-mounted solar panels, a vegetative roof to filter stormwater and electric car charging stations. The children's area, Discovery Village, will be based on a theme of classic children's literature.



## Short Édition Short Story Dispenser

We worked to bring a Short Édition Short Story Dispenser into the Maryland Motor Vehicle Administration location in Beltsville, MD. The Short Story Dispenser is designed to encourage reading by increasing literacy awareness, provide a showcase for novice writers, and emphasize the relevance of literature. Customers at the MVA may choose either 1-, 3- or 5-minute stories
